The average for all participating places, both metropolitan and nonmetropolitan, equals 100, and each participant's index is read as a percentage of the average for all places. 100 is set as the average, states that have an index above 100 are deemed to have a cost of living above the national average and states that have a index below 100 are deemed to have a cost of living below the national average. The average in this table was determined by averaging the four quarters in 2009.

³ Formula for Average Salaries adjusted for Cost of Living: This formula is determined by dividing the average salary by the average cost of living index percentage. The product is the adjusted salary, which reflects the value of a teacher salary of a particular state when the cost of living of that particular state is factor in.

⁴ California would rank second highest in teacher salaries before the Cost of Living adjustment is factored in; with the Cost of Living adjustment factored in, California ranks nineteenth.
